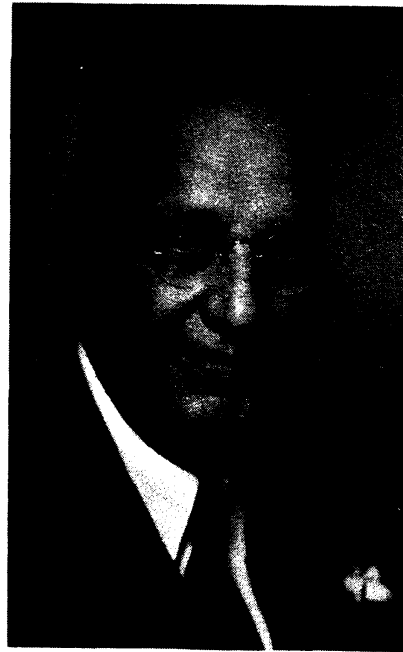
JOHN MILTON
